Comments arising from TOR (Con't)	 It was asked by members if they are here representing themselves or their affiliation. Gord verified that members are here representing themselves and not their affiliation. Members can relay information from the PAC meeting to their respective affiliations but it is not mandatory. Members were selected from certain groups in order to obtain a well represented cross section of user groups amongst the community and surrounding area. 	• All

Comments arising from the SLS Power Point Presentation	 SLS converted from roadside to stumpside processing about 10 years ago to intentionally leave more slash in the blocks. Slash distributed throughout the block provides moisture retention, less soil compaction, provides nutrients to the site and protects seedlings from extreme weather and animal damage. All these factors aid in seedling productivity and survival which ultimately improves reforestation. Leaving slash in the cutblocks has been viewed by the general public as a way to cut cost but SLS pays the harvesting contractor more due to the type of equipment needed to stumpside harvest. SLS follows a Spatial Harvest Sequence (SHS) Map which identifies available timber for SLS to harvest over the next 20yrs. This SHS map was developed and approved by SRD. The timber is broken into two sequences – first decade timber and second decade timber. Timber identified as first decade means SLS must harvest the stands in the first 10 years (0-10yrs). Timber identified as second decade means SLS must harvest the stands in the second 10 years (11-20yrs). This plan was implemented in 2006 so SLS is halfway through the first decade. Talked about how SHS maps show that we have an unnatural high component of old age class pine as a result of successful fire suppression. Harvesting is only one tool to manage these old age class pine stands. Other management options should be explored on ground that is not harvestable (ie. Steep slopes, rocky terrain, riparian areas, unmerchantable timber). Discussed the presence of the Mountain Pine Beetle (MPB) and the possibility of a "surge cut" to gain on the MPB infested and susceptible stands. From a social perspective, SLS would rather sustain a steady annual cut with no highs or lows. It was suggested that it would be to our benefit if SLS communicate with various people/user groups on an on-going basis. The ground rules provide some direction on this (ie. Grazing Timber Agreements with ranchers, trapper referrals, etc.) but does n	• All

Gord discussed what SLS has done to date to influence government to implement an AMP.
