SSRP	Approval of the South Saskatchewan Regional Land Use Plan - Approved in July 2014 - SSRP contains sub plans i.e. access management plans, recreation plans. - update to the C5 DFMP likely to start 2020 Affects to SLS timber supply land base -7000 hectare or ~5.8% reduction to the Timber Supply Land base - No new areas added to the TS land base - Reduction in AAC (annual allowable cut) due to the reduction in the operable land base - Carry over volume from previous undercut AAC has been approved	Gord Lehn Wade Aebli Errol Kutcher

Item 2014/2015 Operations	Review of 2014/2015 on going Operations June 2014 Flood Event - pictures of Honey Coulee June 18, 2014 - Access to 2500 loads carryover volume from previous winter was lost - Ward Ridge Road developed off the Riley Road to access decked volume while repairs to the Honey Coulee access were made - Prior to the flood a 60' bridge was used to span Trout Creek after the flood two 60' bridges with a mid span pier were required to span Trout Creek - A stabilization project of the south bank of Trout Creek included the construction of a "rootwad revetment" http://www.stormwatercenter.net/Assorted%20Fact%20Sheets/Restoration/bank_protection.htm - The media report of on damages in Trout Creek showed the results of flood damage - discussion on the concern of reclamation of access into harvested areas - an access management plan will help direct how roads are managed in the future - minimization of linear disturbance for Grizzly Bear Recovery Strategy and elk security cover - Harvesting - to date ~250ha harvested with an additional 210ha planned before April 2015 - active in the Savanna Cr License along the upper Livingstone River and in the Porcupine Hills along Trout Creek - one block harvested in Dutch Creek completing that license - log haul focused on the Porcupine Hills with ~ 750-800 loads of carry over volume remaining - mid to late February should see the remainder of the carry over volume hauled to either the Longview storage yard or the mill - will store wood again this year at the start of the Honey Coulee Road ~ 300 loads to be hauled during spring break-up - Road Construction - ~32 km of construction this year (17km new construction 15km upgrading existing access) - significant portions of the Honey Coulee Road required to be rebuilt due to flood - Reclamation - 20.5km of reclamation in Allison Cr, Porcupine	Who Wade Aebli Errol Kutcher

2015/2016 Operations	Preview of the 2015/2016 season - Harvesting - ~910ha planned for harvest form Beaver Mines, Porcupine Hills, Upper Livingstone, Spoon Valley, and Savanna Cr - Road Construction / Log Haul - ~50km of road construction planned in the above areas - Reclamation - 49km of road reclamation planned for the Porcupine Hills, Dutch Cr., and Spoon Valley - Reforestation - 1,004,316 seedlings currently being grown in Chinook and Red Rock Nurseries to be planted in Dutch Creek, Allison Creek, and the Porcupine Hills, (26% white spruce, 74% lodgepole pine)	Wade Aebli Errol Kutcher
