A landscape level of planning to address how various resource values will be integrated is a fundamental first step to forest management. Equally important is the need to ensure the objectives cited in the forest management plan flow through to the operational stages of harvest plan development and field delivery.

Harvest operations need to be conducted in such a way as to respect other uses of the forest landscape. This principle holds true for other commercial uses such as grazing, trapping and oilfield activity as well as a broad range of recreational activities, archeological and environmental values.
